## Written statement, short description of the project in English, no more than 250 words

At the corner of 9th avenue and 15th street SE, Calgary, Alberta, Canada, situates the Inglewood Brewery, a historical site that played an essential role in creating Inglewood's identity for over 100 years. The "Brewery Flats" project is constructing a public space to gather the community, while revealing potential green corridors and formalized green spaces to create a participatory cultural hub.


Through mapping the identity of Inglewood and Ramsay, a series of lost, neglected industrial and open spaces began to appear as the morphology of the urban landscape became bounded by the Canadian Pacific Railway and other mobility infrastructures. Discovering this impact created by large mobility infrastructures, the Inglewood Brewery emerged as the site where history, industry, and connectivity converge.

To reveal the beauty of an abandoned, post industrial landscape the "Brewery Flats" project establishes a variety of common spaces where the public can engage in a vibrant, historical, social setting. The common spaces consist of two plazas, a naturalized courtyard, an urban grove and an elevated walkway. Most of the abandoned buildings on site are to be demolished, as they are unsafe and decrepit. The row plantings in the project are commemorating this history while enhancing the area with native, sustainable vegetation. Lastly, the path system along the railway provides a connective green corridor that engages with the industrious nature of this landscape. "Brewery Flats" is reestablishing the heart of Inglewood, through composing a collective of spaces to enrich the experience between people, public spaces and living material.








