

ABSTRACT PEDESTRIAN MOVEMENT



View to degraded areas. The existing deciduous trees improve the view but not fully.



In the summer season, the cafe places its terrace. It's placed very close to the buildings and pedestrian pathways leaving no personal space for pedestrians and cafe visitors.




The existing building (Ventspils Youth house) is blocking the view and not blending in with the historical center's architecture. Right now the building is not in use.



As mentioned before historical heritage and water bodies are a big role in this city. In the 19th century, there wasn't only River Venta, but also a smaller river - a left-hand tributary of the Lower River Venta. The city evolved from this smaller river and the Castle of the Livonian Orden was built (Ventspils Castle).

The goal for this project was to incorporate the small River Venta and adjoining areas in the territory. Another important task was to combine and find a balance between modern and historical elements.



GENERAL PLAN



Through the whole territory flows silhouette of the small river. It is not a water feature, but a shockproof glass with LED lights which serves as decorative lighting in the night time.



Historically this city and especially this area was never with intensive green structure. But there are many deciduous and conifer trees in the current situation. Two of them are protected. As all of them are valuable, it is foreseen to keep all the trees.

Keeping that in mind, the biggest percentage of pavement is hard pavement. To keep all the trees they are put in tree grilles and to prevent water accumulation on the hard pavement there is a designed linear drainage water collection system. At the start of every drainage grid, there are graved historical city street names. The background of the drainage grid is a historical street structure of Ventspils city.








This environmental object / sculpture represents the courtyard of the Castle of the Livonian Order (Ventspils Castle). The light bulbs represent the arcs of Ventspils Castle courtyard. It is not only a sculpture that attracts people's attention but also serves as decorative lighting at the night time. Benches are placed around the object for people to sit and observe it.









These elements are placed at the gathering area. They can be used in many different ways you can use them as a shelter for markets, art gallery stands, as hammock stand and outdoor cinema.
